

REGULAR MEETING

The Town Council of the Town of Weber City met in a regular meeting at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 17, 2021. The meeting was held in the assembly room of the Weber City Town Hall. Vice Mayor Justin Addington called the meeting to order. Pledge of Allegiance by all in attendance. Eileen Deckard led the council in prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion to accept the July 20, 2021 regular monthly meeting minutes, was made by Larry Wagner, the motion was seconded by Eileen Deckard; the motion passed with 3 voting AYES: none voting NAY: 3 Absent.

Motion to accept the July 2021 Financial Report was made by Eileen Deckard; the motion was seconded by Larry Wagner; the motion passed with 3 voting AYES: none voting NAY: 3 Absent.

Public Presentations: Mike Carrico questioned outstanding checks. The clerk explained that the Interim Mayor Greg Smith was holding the check to the Scott County Treasurer for building inspections pending further review with the county.

Finance Committee: No report

Fire Department: No Report

Legal Affairs. Mike Carrico stated the Zoning ordinance is not yet complete. Eileen Deckard asked if this could be completed by the end of the month. Mike Carrico stated to Eileen Deckard that she would need to meet with him at his office to finalize; after that, public hearings would be required. He would have to clarify if one or two special called meetings would be required for proper publication.

Maintenance Committee: Casey Kinkead was absent. No quotes are in for the entrance area to the town hall. Vice-Mayor Justin Addington stated that the leaking into the basement area might have been determined. The windows have brick window seals, this allows water to run under the windows along the side of the building and down through the blocks, and a flashing would need to be installed.

Mayors Report: Vice-Mayor Justin Addington stated he was simply a fill-in and this section would be skipped over until next month.

Personnel Committee: None.

Police Department: Chief of Police Matt Bishop stated he was very proud of his officers and the numbers that he has for activities; they have worked very hard. Mr. Bishop handed out a list of incidents totaling 225.

Street Committee: Larry Wagner stated that last month he had went to Kilgore's office and still nothing back regarding Church Street. Teresa Tilson followed up regarding holes on Tulip Poplar Street; this has been reported to VDOT and awaiting evaluation. Mike Carrico stated he also had complaints on the area at Boones Heating and Air, the road along US Hwy 23 is creating flooding to the area. Chief Bishop also

brought up issues WITH drainage creating issues along Reading, Venture and Legion. Eileen Deckard stated that maybe we would need to speak with Morgan Griffith again. Mike Carrico stated there is a clear water drainage issue within the town.

Eileen Deckard requested the 20 feet along her driveway she would like turned over to her. Mike Carrico stated a public hearing would need to be held to close the street. Mike Carrico suggested that the Street Committee go and evaluate the area and report next month to the council on the recommendations.

Eileen Deckard questioned when the Moccasin Gap dumpster would reopen now that the VDOT roadwork has been completed. The board discussed rumors that the station is intended to not reopen with the possibility of making this a parking lot to transport visitors to the ball field.

A motion for a resolution to send a letter to the county board of supervisors requesting they not close the solid waste transfer station at Moccasin Gap was made by Eileen Deckard; the motion was seconded by Teresa Tilson; the motion passed with 3 voting AYES: none voting NAY 3 ABSENT.

Eileen Deckard suggested the town donate the washer and dryer from the town to the Fire Department. The system is too large to use in the town hall and the Fire Department will allow the officers to use the washer and dryer at the fire department as needed.

A motion to donate the commercial washer and dryer that was received with Covid money be given to the Weber City Fire Department was made by Eileen Deckard; the motion was seconded by Larry Wagner; the motion passed with 3 voting AYES: none voting NAY 3 ABSENT.

Chief Bishop stated he would get with the Fire Chief and coordinate the transfer.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion to adjourn was made by Larry Wagner; the motion was seconded by Eileen Deckard; the motion passed with 3 voting AYES: none voting NAY 3 ABSENT.
